

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Information on arrival in Shanghai

Arrival at the airport

Please be aware that there are two airports in Shanghai: Pudong international airport and Hongqiao airport. Pudong international airport is about 30 kilometres from the city centre and Hongqiao airport is 18km from the Bund.

Taxi

From Pudong International airport, a taxi to the city centre will cost around Y160 and will take about an hour. From Hongqiao airport a taxi to the Bund will cost around Y70 and will take 30 to 60 minutes. The taxi queues at Hongqiao are frequently astonishing and wait for an hour or more are common. In both cases, join the taxi ranks and ignore approaches from drivers. When you get into the taxi, make sure the driver uses the meter. It is also useful to have the name of your hotel written down in Chinese to show the driver. (See document enclosed)
