# 5<sup>th</sup> World Water Forum

## **Programme of Kyoto World Water Grand Prize activities**

Through the Kyoto World Water Grand Prize, 30 excellent local grassroots activities were selected to present their work to the global water community at the 5<sup>th</sup> World Water Forum. 19 of them are pre-selected candidates, and will not be competing directly for the prize, but will be aiming to share the lessons learnt from their work with Forum participants and with other candidates. These pre-selected candidates will be presenting their activities daily from March 17<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup>, between 13:00 and 14:15 in the Global Water Education Village.

11 finalists have been selected to compete directly for the Prize, and will be presenting to both the 12-person International Panel of Judges and interested Forum participants on March 21<sup>st</sup>, between 12:30 and 15:15, in the Citizen's Water House.
